Alfa Laval Company is a Swedish firm, founded in 1883 by Gustaf de Laval and Oscar Lamm. It deals with the production of specialized products and solutions for heavy industry. The company is headquartered in Lund, Sweden. The products are used to heat, cool, separate and transport such products as oil, water, chemicals, beverages, foodstuffs, starch and pharmaceuticals. It has more than 3700 patents which provide worldwide solutions in areas that are vital to society both for the present and for the future. Alfa Laval's worldwide organization helps customers in nearly 100 countries to optimize their processes. As of early 2021, it has 42 major production units and has approximately 16,882 employees. Its products are also used in nuclear power, onboard vessels; and in the engineering sector, mining industry and refinery sector as well as treating wastewater and creating a comfortable indoor climate. Alfa Laval also received the 2018 GREEN4SEA Technology Award.

Alfa Laval has been recognized as a supplier of high-quality products, providing value for their customers. 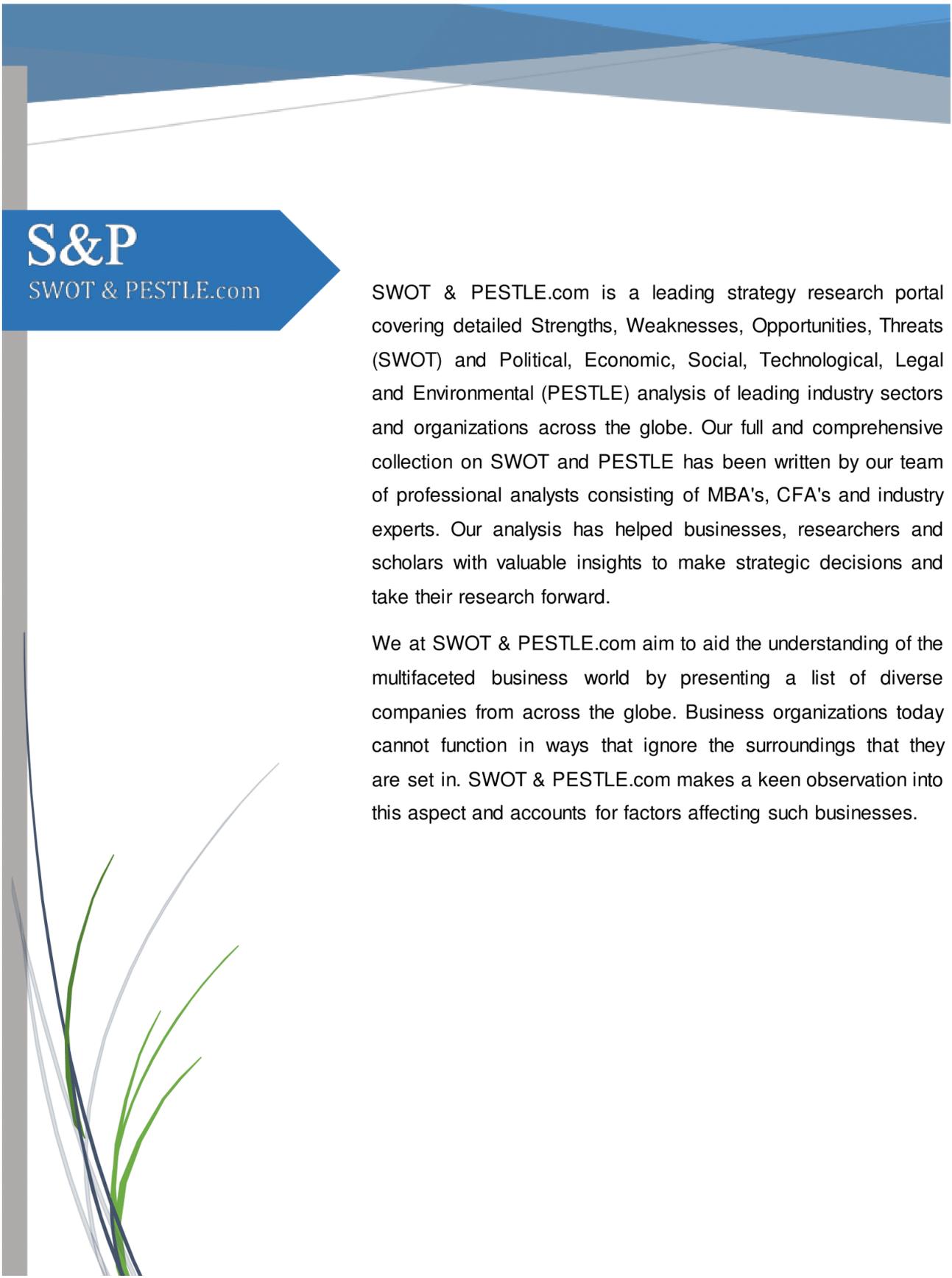
