**About the Company :** CAE Inc. (formerly Canadian Aviation Electronics) is a Canadian simulation, modelling, and training company that serves airlines, aircraft manufacturers, healthcare professionals, and defence customers. The headquarters of the organisation are in Quebec, Canada. In 1947, Ken Patrick established CAE and it now has manufacturing and training facilities in 35 countries. The firm sells flight simulators and training devices to airlines, aircraft manufacturers and training centres. It has a professional services division and licences its modelling tools to a variety of market segments. In its 50 aviation training centres around the world, CAE offers airline pilot and business jet pilot training. The company provides initial and recurrency training for airlines like JetBlue as well as non-airline companies like charter and freight operators in the United States. It also runs the CAE Oxford Aviation Academy, the world's largest ab initio flight training network, with over 220 aircraft and seven campuses around the world, as well as the CAE Global Academy Phoenix and Sabena Flight Academy in Belgium. In May 2021, CAE USA and Pinnacle Solutions reported that their joint venture business, Xebec Government Services, has been awarded a contract to provide the US Army with a new and improved Maritime Integrated Training System (MITS).

CAE Inc.'s Unique Selling Point or USP lies in it being a high-tech firm that is on the cutting edge of digital immersion providing solutions to make the world a safer environment. CAE's vision statement reads, "To be the worldwide partner of choice in civil aviation, defence and security, and healthcare by revolutionizing our customers' training and critical operations with digitally immersive solutions to elevate the safety, efficiency and readiness".
